The Papacy (part II)

"The gates of hell shall not prevail" signifies the Church is indefectible. In his Modern Catholic Dictionary, Fr. John Hardon SJ neatly sums *Pastor Aeternus*, the First Dogmatic Constitution of the Church of Christ (Pope Pius IX, July 18, 1870 at Vatican Council I): "The Church's indefectibility, therefore, means that she now is and will always remain the institution of salvation in her teaching, her constitution, and her liturgy. It does not exclude modifications that do not affect her substance, not does it exclude the decay of individual local churches or even whole dioceses."

As God became Incarnate for the purpose of saving souls, so the Church must be visible and service the saving souls; nor can the Church perish or be changed, in any of her three essential offices of teaching, governing & sanctifying. Again, until the end of time, the Church will visibly: 1) teach, without error, faith, morals & disciplines necessary for salvation; 2) govern by deacons, priests and bishops, one of whom, the pope, will hold supreme authority; and, 3) distribute supernatural grace, especially through her Sacraments.

"The keys to the kingdom of heaven" refers to authority in the Church held, in a supreme way, by Peter & his successors; nor is "whatsoever" in binding or loosing taken absolutely, which would be both ridiculous and unbiblical. Recall the Lord's words: "Whatsoever you shall ask the Father in My Name, that I will do." Now, to ask in this Name, is to ask for things of salvation. Just so, the "whatsoever" authority given to Peter is for the Church, not to change her, but to govern her; "the keys" are not meant for any door or any purpose. Imagine otherwise. Say a pope invoked the authority of "the keys" to decree that "monkeys fly" or "in 1492 Christopher Columbus did not sail the ocean blue." Nothing would change. In the same way, should a pope decree marshmallows as new matter for Mass or milk for baptism, no Sacrament would happen. The power of the keys have no power over nature, human history, or realities divinely ordained. Again, the pope has no authority to change the Commandments, the Creed or the elements essential to the Sacraments. Some real-life examples: Not long ago, to those advocating a women's priesthood & recognizing the limits of his authority, pope St. John Paul II replied, "The Church has no authority to do this." In another time & place, a friend at a Catechism Class where Sr. Holy Water, (nor her real name but that's what he said), kept telling the children that, one day, women would be priests. Finally, he tired, stood up & said, "Sister, ordaining a woman is like ordaining a fence post (he was a rancher), you can ordain & ordain & it just won't take." He is right; neither is the proper matter for the Sacrament; the Church has no authority here.

The Haydock Bible Commentary sums-up the authority "to bind": 1. refusing to absolve; 2. enjoining penance for sins forgiven; 3. excommunication, suspension or interdict; 4. making rules & laws for governing the Church; 5. determining what is of the faith by judgments & definitions of the Church. The authority "to loose" refers to: remitting the punishment owed to forgiven sins by way of indulgences.

A word about "bad popes." The Church has had bad popes as shepherds; but these more defend the Church's indefectibility than harm it. How? While these lived immoral lives and/or held false opinions, they never demanded the Church change her belief or practice in things necessary for salvation. Indeed, bad popes prove that the Church is divinely protected; if not, she surely would have expired long ago. More, if the Church were always ruled by saintly, learned & talented men, the world would more credit her successes to human ability than divine aid. Again, the Church's durability has been surely proved by her 2000 years of existence; but her indefectibility is more evident by the bad popes, from time to time, elected to her headship.
