Eucharistic Heresies before the Protestant Reformation

In A Eucharistic Retreat, Fr. Hardon writes, "There is a mysterious sense in which we can thank God's Providence for drawing so much good and so much depth of truth from the errors propagated by those who deny a mystery of the faith. (p. 13) Again, he says, "heresy has contributed immensely to the sanctification of the Church." How? In correcting error, which heresy makes possible, the Church grows in the knowledge of what she teaches; and, when the human mind more clearly understands truth, so much more may the human will put in practice what the mind knows more fully.

Preceding the most divisive era of Christian history, the Protestant Reformation of the 1600's, we look at three authors of Eucharistic heresy.

In the Church's first thousand years, there is no notable heresy against her teaching on the Most Holy Eucharist.

The first heresy against Christ in the Eucharist happens in the 11th century. For more than forty years, the Benedictine monk, Berengarius, off and on, taught that Christ is not in the Eucharist. Although submitting to Church corrections time and again, he would only relapse; happily, he eventually died reconciled with the Church. In 1079, at the 6th Council of Rome, he signed a profession of faith basic to the true understanding on the Catholic Church's teaching on the Real Presence and helpful to us:

"I... believe interiorly and profess publically that the bread and wine which are placed on the altar, through the mystery of the Sacred Prayer and the words of our Redeemer, are substantially changed into the true, proper and life-giving Flesh and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. After the consecration, It is the true Body of Christ, which was born to the Virgin, and which hung on the Cross as an offering for the salvation of the world, and which sits at the right hand of the Father. And It is the true Blood of Christ which was poured forth from His side. And Christ is present not merely by virtue of the sign and power of the sacrament but in His proper nature and true substance. This I believe and will not teach any more against this faith... so help me God and this holy Gospel of God!" (Dz 355)

Next is the convert from the Waldenses, **Durand of Huesca**. The Waldenses were a cult which claimed the people offer Mass for which holiness is required. In converting in 1207, Durand had to sign a profession of faith affirming only priests can offer Mass and the power to confect the Sacrament is not derived from the holiness of the priest but from the Sacrament of Holy Orders (thus, a priest in mortal sin may offer a valid Mass.)

Last is **John Wycliffe**, a 14th century scholar at the University of Oxford in England. He promoted the errors: the substance of bread and wine remain in the Sacrament of the altar, the appearances of bread and wine do not remain without a substance in said sacrament, Christ is not in the sacrament essentially and really in His own bodily presence, a bishop or priest in mortal sin cannot confect the Sacrament.

To end, authors of heresy benefit the Church by causing her to better define her belief. BUT to hold on to the heresy, after the Church has defined herself, is spiritual suicide. Of course, the cause of this is pride. This is why Jesus said, "Unless you be converted and become as little children, you shall not enter the kingdom of heaven." (Mt 18:3).

Things to Know at Christ the King (CtK)

Sunday Best: Sunday is a day given especially to Almighty God. In part, we show this by how we dress at the holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this day. When sitting, a woman's dress should reach below her knees, cover her shoulders, and rest near the pit of the throat; a man should wear a suit & tie, or, at least, a collared shirt & clean slacks.

Baptism: we ask that all families be active, registered parishioners 6 months prior

to receiving this Sacrament. **First Holy Communion & Confirmation**: your child's regular attendance at our catechism classes is anticipated of them before receiving these sacraments.

catechism classes is anticipated of them before receiving these sacraments. **Matrimony**: arrangements with the parish should be made at least 6 months in advance of a wedding date; participation in a priest conducted marriage preparation program is required.
