In his book, <u>Retreat with the Lord</u>, Fr. John Hardon SJ, reflects upon the last words of the Risen Christ of today's Gospel: *When the Risen Christ said*, *"All power is given me in heaven and on earth," he meant especially his moral power to command all rational creatures to obey his will.*

True Christian faith requires both a firm belief in the divinity of Christ and complete submission to his will. Anyone who simply believes that Jesus is divine but does not do his will is a fire without flame, a pretender. The divinity of Christ, "and this needs to be stressed," Fr Hardon writes, gives him the right "to command our wills to obey his will." Indeed, he made this the test of our fidelity to him: "If you love me, keep my commandments." (Jn 14:15)

At Christmas, the angel was sent to the shepherds, saying, "I bring you good news of great joy that shall be *to all the people*." (Lk 2) This first evangelization now continues through the Church. Again, the Church, the universal sacrament, has and always will announce to our fallen world the message of great joy "to all the people." Father reminds us that "Catholic" means "universal" and "part of this universality is the divine mandate to evangelize."

Alas, in our age of communication, father writes, some question this mandate, saying non-Christians are really "anonymous Christians" who should be left to follow their own persuasions and not be actively evangelized. "This is not the teaching of Christ."

In the Church's, which is to say, in our work to evangelize others, the practical Fr. Hardon identifies three essentials:

> They are to be made "disciples." They are to be taught what Christ revealed so their minds accept his teaching in humility of faith.

> They are to be baptized. They are to be reborn in spirit through the waters of Baptism.

> They are to observe all the commandments which Jesus Christ enjoined upon the human race.

The Son of God said as much: "Go, therefore, <u>teach ye all nations</u>, <u>baptizing them</u> in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, <u>teaching them to observe all</u> things whatsoever I have commanded you."

The final words of the Risen Christ should give us confidence in our work: "Behold I am with you all days, even to the end of the world." Father says this divine promise is fulfilled both by the physical Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and his mystical presence in the Church. "With him we can convert the whole world to his name."

To end, we must make daily efforts to advance our salvation and that of others, all for the greater honor and glory of God. We must never forget that we have been made by God and for God – as much as our neighbor - so that, one day, we may be joined forever to the Most Holy Trinity. To miss this, our primary vocation, is our greatest misfortune.

How many spend their lives in circles, going round and round in an amusement park of vain diversions, who do much without doing anything. May it never happen to us that we forget that, at every moment, we have a great work about us, namely, an eternity upon our hands, the neglect of which is to miss the only real concern of life.

Things to Know at Christ the King (CtK)

Sunday Best: Sunday is a day given especially to almighty God. In part, we show this by how we dress at the holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this day. When sitting, a woman's dress should reach below her knees, cover her shoulders, and rest near the pit of the throat; a man should wear a suit & tie, or, at least, a collared shirt & clean slacks.

Baptism: we ask that all families be active, registered parishioners 6 months prior to receiving this Sacrament.

First Holy Communion & Confirmation: your child's regular attendance at our catechism classes is anticipated of them before receiving these sacraments. **Matrimony**: arrangements with the parish should be made at least 6 months in advance of a wedding date; participation in a priest conducted marriage preparation program is required.

Regarding Confession, as often time is limited to deal with situations in Confession, please know that the priests at CtK are available to meet with you outside confession times to help you with your spiritual dilemmas; simply call the office to arrange an appointment with either priest.

If you are new to the parish, it would please the pastor to meet with you; you may arrange an appointment through the secretary.
