

Today's Introit is composed of a free verse and Psalm 77, verse 1. We review them scripturally then understand them in relation to the feast.

I am the salvation of the people, saith the Lord: in whatever tribulation they shall cry to me, I will hear them; and I will be their Lord forever.

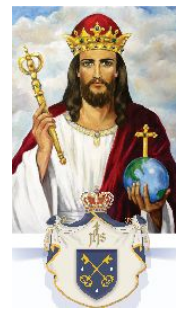
The free verse is a gloss on the Psalms in general and the Faith in particular. ***I am the salvation of the people.*** This is said especially of Jesus Christ, whose special mission is the redemption of the human race, won by His life, death, and resurrection. ***In whatever tribulation they shall cry to me, I will hear them.*** *Tribulatione*, derives from *tribulum* meaning a threshing machine. In what straits we find ourselves, if we cry to Jesus, He hears us not as a mere bystander, but as Someone who, because He suffered too, may sympathize and, because He is almighty God, is able to rescue us. Just so, by Him we have an eternal rescue: ***I will be their Lord forever.***

Psalm 77 is paraphrased: "God's great benefits to the people of Israel, notwithstanding their ingratitude."

1. ***Attend, O my people, to my law; incline your ears to the words of my mouth.***

St. Robert Bellarmine says David begins this long psalm, 72 verses, by first awakening the listener using words of urgency & utility. ***Attend, O my people, to my law.*** David speaks to his people as a king about his law by which the people are governed... which only has the purpose of the true happiness of the nation in mind. ***Incline your ears*** repeats the injunction: *Attend*; similarly, the phrase ***to the words of my mouth*** echoes anew: *to my law*. St. Robert reminds us that it is not the law of Moses here referenced but the law of David; when the law of Moses is invoked it is simply called "the law", here David personalizes saying, "my law" and "the words of my mouth." Moreover, in reference to the people, to incline the ear means to hear with humility and obedience; when applied to God, it means to hear with clemency and mercy. Finally, St. Robert mentions that some take Psalm 77 as spoken in the person of God, others of Christ, but verse three "and our fathers told us" reveals that David speaks in his own person, not that of another.

The Feast of the 19th Sunday after Pentecost, Wedding Garment Sunday, speaks on the prerequisite of heaven. The Epistle: "put on the new man" and the Gospel: "Friend, how came in here without a wedding garment?" both remind us of the clothing required for entry into the heavenly kingdom. The Church calls this garment 'sanctifying grace' whereby a person is identified as a friend of God and heir of heaven. This garment is the principle reason for the Incarnation: Jesus came to save us from sin and clothe us with a divine likeness of Himself. This is not of ourselves, so that no one may boast, but a work of almighty God. Nor is it obtained by following a will, or a law, other than that of God. **Again, Jesus is our salvation and our garment: put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ (Rm 13:14).** **Attending to His law, we will surely be heard as regards to our true necessities; and, one day, we will find ourselves attending a wedding feast, clothed with a like glory of Him, forever.**
