

Today's Introit takes from the 36th chapter of Ecclesiasticus (Sirach), verse 18 and from Psalm 121, verse 1. We review them scripturally then understand them in relation to the feast.

Ecclesiasticus, a wisdom book of the bible, concerns wisdom in general; in particular, chapter 36 presents a prayer of the church & descriptions of a good heart & wife.

18. *Reward them that patiently wait for thee, that thy prophets may be found faithful: and hear the prayers of thy servants.* 19. According to the blessing of Aaron over thy people, and direct us into the way of justice, and let all know that dwell upon the earth, that thou art God the beholder of all ages.

Having prayed for the mercy of God & helps to overcome evil, Ecclesiasticus ("the preacher") now asks for a reward by reason of patience, the prophets, and through the ministry of Aaron's priesthood.

Psalm 121 is paraphrased: "The desire and hope of the just for the coming of the kingdom of God, and the peace of his church."

1. *I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of the Lord.*

St. Robert Bellarmine says this is how the exiled Hebrews expressed their joy on hearing of their return to their home country. He writes, "Jeremias announced that, after seventy years, there would be an end of the captivity, and that the city and the temple would be rebuilt. Daniel, Aggeus, and Zacharias, who lived at the time the captivity ended, foretold it more clearly; and they, therefore, created much more joy among the people when, on the completion of 70 years, they said, "We shall go into the house of the Lord"; that is to say, we shall return to our country (538 BC), where we shall get to see Mount Sion and the site of the house of the Lord; and then, when we shall have rebuilt the temple (520 BC), we will again, "go into the house of the Lord."

The Feast of the 18th Sunday after Pentecost recalls the ordinations of Ember Saturday. The Epistle: "I give thanks to God... that in all things you are made rich in him..." and the Gospel: "And the multitude seeing it feared and glorified God who had given such power to men" witness God enriching humanity through His creature... which we especially identify with the priesthood. The vulgate reads, *Da mercedem* "Give reward"; the missal reads, *Da pacem* "Give peace"... but is not the reward peace and peace the reward? This is what all men seek, this is what Christ came to impart: peace with God and peace among men... so they are not so much at odds as one may initially think. Those who patiently wait for God during their exile, will eventually be rewarded with return to their homeland. This is the story of the prophets and the prayer of God's servants. And, of course, the primary instrument of this peace comes through the sacraments, and, in a special way, through the continuation of Christ's mission through His priests who have a special connection to "the house of the Lord."
