

Today's Introit takes from Prophecies of Jeremiah, chapter 29, verses 11, 12, & 14; then from Psalm 84, verse 2. We review them scripturally then understand them in relation to the feast. The parenthesis mark Introit omissions.

Jeremiah, second of the 4 great prophets (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel), was a priest living within the tribe of Benjamin whom God made His prophet while in the womb. For 40-years, up-to and after the Fall of Jerusalem (587 BC), he warned Israel for her failings & consoled her during her exile.

Chapter 29 of Jeremiah contains Jeremiah's letter to the captives in Babylon, which exhorts them to be patient and resist false prophets; it also predicts Israel's return from exile after 70 years & the death of those staying at Jerusalem by sword, famine, and pestilence.

11. (For I know the thoughts) ***I think towards you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of affliction,*** (to give you an end and patience.) 12. And ***you shall call upon me,*** (and you shall go, and you shall pray to me,) ***and I shall hear you.***
13. (You shall seek me and shall find me: when you shall seek me with all your heart.) 14. (And I will be found by you, saith the Lord:) ***and I will bring back your captivity,*** (and I will gather you out of all nations, and) ***from all the places*** (to which I have driven you out, saith the Lord: and I will bring you back from the place to which I caused you to be carried away captive.)

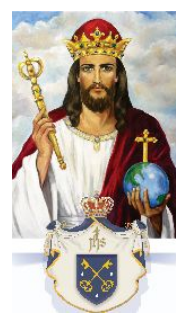
Here is a good example of the Church's 'cut & paste' process whereby she obtains her liturgical Introits... to get the main idea across. God, through Jeremiah, reveals His eternal disposition of eager mercy to help His people, if but they call upon Him.

Psalm 84 is paraphrased: "The coming of Christ to bring peace and salvation to man."

2. ***Lord, thou has blessed thy land: thou has turned away the captivity of Jacob.***

Psalm 84, says St. Robert Bellarmine, attests God's eternal decree to save man through the motive of His love; this love ultimately delivers man from bondage to sin by the Resurrection. ***Thou hast blessed thy land, thou hast turned away the captivity,*** refers not just to Jacob's lineage, the Israelite nation, but to all mankind, which, like a wild branch, is grafted onto Jacob's stem. In addition, there may be an illusion to the Babylonian exile and Israel's eventual liberation... as per above.

The Feast of the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost, speaks on the end times. The Epistle speaks of destruction for those who reject the cross of Christ, "whose God is their belly"; the Gospel reveals two wonderful miracles of Jesus wrought by touching: "come and lay thy hand upon her and she shall live" and "if I shall touch only the hem of his garment, I shall be healed." My we walk as true Christians, embracing our crosses, and with a firm belief in that touching Him will bring us healing and peace.
