
St. John Bosco was a 19th century priest who took in and cared for orphan boys. One sunny day, he went fishing with three of his boys on Skyway Pier. After some time, and no bites, he cast them a question: “What would you do if you were informed right now that you had three days to live? What would be the first thing you would do and how would you spend that time?”

The first boy said, “I would leave and go immediately to the chapel and spend the remaining days praying and repenting.” The second boy said he would do the same. The third boy, however, said he would continue fishing. Interestingly, the third boy did die at a young age and ended up being canonized a Saint. His name is St. Dominic Savio.

The point of the story is that the road to heaven includes such things as fishing on a pier. This was St. Dominic’s point in saying he would continue fishing. No doubt, the young Saint valued the presence of God in the sanctuary, prayed his morning & evening prayers and daily Rosary, frequented the Sacraments and avoided occasions of sin. In all these he saw and sought God. Just so, even of his recreations, St. Dominic Savio was making an offering to God.

Seeing everywhere the presence of God is the key to sanctity. If we keep on the lookout, we will find Him in the office behind a computer; at home doing dishes; at school, working on a math problem; on the playing field; in restaurants, in the streets & in prisons; while shopping at Publix. And when we daily acknowledge this truth and act accordingly, our daily circumstances and the environment in which they occur, will pave the way to heaven for us. As such, if it should ever happen that we be notified that death is imminent, we, as St. Dominic, could very well go on living life as normal.

Said again, having now the presence of God, when death knocks on our door, with a peaceful resignation, perhaps even joy, we can say: “Ah, there you are. I have been waiting too long for you to take me Home.”
