

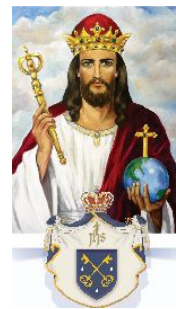
## On the Eucharistic Revival (a flash in a pan?)

The U.S. Bishops have called for a National Eucharistic revival to “renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.” This revival will span 3 years, in 3 parts: "Diocesan Revival" (6/19/22 - 6/11/23); "Parish Revival" (6/11/23-7/17/24); and "Going out on Mission" (7/21/24 - Pentecost 2025). In its response, the Diocese of Venice will host a Eucharistic Congress on March 24 & 25 at the Caloosa Sound Convention Center & Luminary Hotel in Fort Myers.

**Q.** Why do the bishops think we need a Eucharistic revival? **A.** Because only 31% of practicing Catholics believe in the True Presence. Again, the Holy Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith, is the true body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread; It is the identical Jesus Christ who was conceived in the womb of Mary & born in Bethlehem; who breathed our air, ate our food & drank our water; who suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, and buried; who rose again from the dead & now sits at the right hand of God the Father while simultaneously residing on earth in the consecrated Species confectioned at every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Most Catholics do not know this & the revival is meant to change this. Will it? Will this new \$28 million program be the cure? Unless it practices what it preaches, it will only treat but not cure the problem. Here are some practicable suggestions towards a cure:

1. Return the tabernacle to the center of the sanctuary.
2. Mandate Holy Communion on the tongue & kneeling (for those who can kneel) & use the paten.
3. Mandate the priest face altar (*ad orientem*) when offering the Holy Sacrifice.
4. Get rid of the ordinary use of Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers, and use them only in extraordinary circumstances, e.g., in feeding the 5000, Jesus gave the bread to his 12 disciples to give to the people who numbered 5000 men; this means these 12 men each served 416 persons. Therefore, one priest should be sufficient for 400 people.
5. Teach what is “Transubstantiation,” (e.g., "by the consecration of the bread and wine a change is brought about of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord, and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of His blood. This change the holy Catholic Church properly and appropriately calls transubstantiation." (Session III, Chapter IV, Council of Trent, Oct. 1551).
6. Discipline pro-abortion Catholic politicians who receive Holy Communion willy-nilly.
7. Re-introduce the single genuflection at entering & exiting a pew and at certain Incarnational phrases, e.g., "Et verbum caro factum est!"
8. Re-introduce the double genuflection at the Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament.
9. Cover the altar when it is not in use.
10. Put permanently in the bulletin: "Welcome to *such and such* Catholic Church. Please know: a. Only Catholics may receive the Holy Eucharist; b. Only practicing Catholics (e.g., who attend Mass on Sundays and holy days throughout the year) may receive Holy Eucharist; c. Only practicing Catholics aware of no mortal sin may receive Holy Eucharist.

**To end,** talk about the Holy Eucharist is not enough, we need to show this in practice. Again, to say something is holy, but not treat it so, is inconsistent. This new program will be a lasting cure in belief in the True Presence if such actions as above follow. Otherwise, it will treat a symptom, but not cure the disease. Meanwhile, it will look like something is being done, while somebody is making easy money.

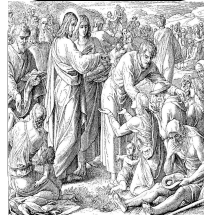

### Things to Know at Christ the King (CtK)

**Sunday Best:** Sunday is a day given especially to almighty God. In part, we show this by how we dress at the holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this day. When sitting, a woman's dress should reach below her knees, cover her shoulders, and rest near the pit of the throat; a man should wear a suit & tie, or, at least, a collared shirt & clean slacks.

**Baptism:** we ask that all families be active, registered parishioners 6 months prior to receiving this Sacrament.

**First Holy Communion & Confirmation:** your child's regular attendance at our catechism classes is anticipated of them before receiving these sacraments.

**Matrimony:** arrangements with the parish should be made at least 6 months in advance of a wedding date; participation in a priest conducted marriage preparation program is required.

**Regarding Confession,** as often time is limited to deal with situations in Confession, please know that the priests at CtK are available to meet with you outside confession times to help you with your spiritual dilemmas; simply call the office to arrange an appointment with either priest.

**If you are new to the parish,** it would please the pastor to meet with you; you may arrange an appointment through the secretary.
