

Today's Introit takes from Psalm 54 verses 17, 18, 20, 23, & 2 and 3. We review them scripturally then understand them in relation to today's feast.

Psalm 54 is paraphrased: "A prayer of the just man under persecution." The Introit omits the Psalm verse contents within the parenthesis... and, as you may see, slightly adapts some wording of the Psalm.

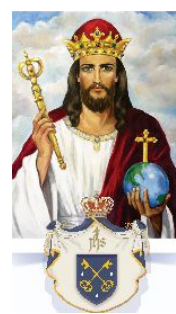
17. **But I cried to God:** (and the Lord will save me.) 18. (Evening and morning and at noon I will speak and declare); **and he shall hear my voice.** 19. (He shall redeem my soul in peace) **from them that draw near to me:** (for among many they were with me.) 20. (God shall hear and) **the eternal shall humble them.** For there is no change with them, and they have not feared God. 23. **Cast thy care upon the Lord, and he shall sustain thee:** (he shall not suffer the just to waver forever.)

Lamenting the persecutions of the just, the prophet affirms his confidence in God: "I cried to God, he shall save me." He cries not once, but thrice or a multitude of times, in the day, in recounting his misfortunes but also the mercies of the Lord; and he is convicted: "he shall hear my voice." God shall restore "my soul in peace"; regardless of the nearness of my persecutors or their advantage of numbers. The just are heard by the eternal, unchanging God, and He humbles them who have become hardened, unchanging or impenitent, in their crimes. Finally, the prophet ends the Psalm with a consolation to himself, and all in like circumstances, that a firm confidence in God is our only true solace: "Cast thy care..." leave to divine providence what you need for your support and "he shall sustain you" with true necessities. Although God may sometimes allow the just to waver by want of things in this life, such will not be the case with things needful for eternity, nor shall they waver at all - once in that Blessed Land itself.

2 Hear, O God, my prayer and despise not my supplication. 3. Be attentive to me, and hear me. (I am grieved in my exercises; and am troubled.)

St. Bellarmine observes David beginning Psalm 54 "to arrest the benevolence of the Judge" by asking for a kind and patient hearing. Afterwards, he refers to the person praying, "Be attentive to me..." look upon me... and adds the reason, "I am grieved... and troubled."

The Feast of the 10th Sunday after Pentecost imparts a lesson of humility in our relations with God and man. The Epistle prompts us to see the workings of God in our neighbor, "...the manifestation of the spirit is given to every man unto profit"; the Gospel exhorts us towards an honest self-effacement before God, "...be merciful to me, a sinner." These, together, agree with the maxim of the saints: "Account each one as better than yourself, and yourself alone as needing God's mercy."
